



# CHI CHAPTER MINUTES Tuesday, September 1, 2020 7:00-8:30 pm — via Zoom Meeting

President Mary Ann Hart welcomed members and called the meeting to order. Darla Mintz, secretary, took the roll as the members joined the Zoom site. New member prospects Teresa Owens and Caroline Armfield were introduced.

Members joined in the reading of the Chapter Collect. A quorum was established. The minutes of the March 2020 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Two visitors were present, Caroline Armfield, music education major at UNC-Greensboro, and Teresa Owens, High Point University Instructor.

President Mary Ann Hart made a motion to adopt a new meeting format for all agendas to allow for members to express concerns or business that would be taken up later in the agenda under "New Business."

Susan Martz made a motion to adopt the new agenda format. Gayle Brookbank seconded. The new meeting format for agendas was adopted.

Nancy Tucker, Treasurer, presented the end-of-year financial report and the proposed budget. She reported that as of August 25, 2020, the balance in the checking account is \$5737.27 and the balance in Business Money

Rate Savings is 1,322.54. Increases to certain line items were because of unspent money on the spring banquet and generous member donations of their banquet monies to Chi items. Nancy requested \$60 total for up to three first-time convention goers to be made a permanent budget item in Chi's budget. Anne Sheffield made the motion and Judy Gecinger seconded. The motion was approved.

Communications and Marketing Chair, Anne Sheffield, reported a disappointing 58% response from Evite, announced September 22 as the next deadline for submissions to *Keynotes for Chi*, reported that the link to the most recent NC DKG newsletter had been emailed to members, and requested any member email changes. Please email Anne if you have not received a newsletter. Betsy Hodge reported that she sent the letters to families of Dorris Koontz and Helen Sheffield. An explanation of the cancelled state convention was included. A copy of the chapter letter in the book of remembrance was given and the families sent notes of appreciation.

Sylvia Eaglin reported that both the on-line directory and the rules had been emailed/postal mailed to members and asked for feedback from anyone not receiving those documents. Two up-to-date changes were needed in the rules about the new dues payment date of July 1 (Sections IV.A.1 and V.G.1.) Sylvia was thanked for the excellent job on the directory.

Global Awareness Chair, Judy Gecinger, announced the raising of money for the food bank mentioned in Keynotes. Please send money to Nancy Tucker with memo "Global Awareness." **Scholarships and Grants Chair, Kay Tucker,** announced the deadline for mini-grants as October 15. Applications will be mailed to eligible members.

Membership Chair, Betty Mayer, introduced Chi's four new members, explained how they will be inducted, told about the distribution of the Starbucks cards for our Chi classroom teachers, and asked for help in recruiting new members. Betty thanked **Tonya Welch** who loaded the prospect form onto Chi website. Address is on the front of our directory under the tab membership. If you have any trouble completing the

card online, please contact Betty Mayer or print it out and mail to Betty.

**Educational Law and Policy Chair, Betsy Hodge,** expressed gratitude to those who submitted questions for political candidates. Letters and emails from Chi supporting the Hero's Bill were sent to Sen. Thom Tillis and Sen. Phil Berger.

Mary Ann asked for a motion for Kayla Ranew to be Vice-President, Susan Martz made a motion to accept Kayla as vice president and Lyn Chandler seconded. Kayla Ranew was voted in as the new vice president unanimously.

Phyllis McCoy, Projects and Fund-Raising Chair, asked members to read her article in *Keynotes* about items needed for the Carpenter House by December 8, Guilford Justice Center in January, and L.E.A.P. in February. Phyllis asked members to begin collecting books so that we could increase our donation from 70 to 100 books for L.E.A.P.'s Four Little Free Libraries. There is a need for more middle and high school level books. Plans for the state convention include selling tumblers and jewelry bags which are already paid for. Phyllis asked for suggestions for t-shirts with the DKG emblem. Phyllis asked for any other ideas to be shared with her committee and thanked everyone for their contributions.

**New Business: Mary Ann reported** that we now have an unlimited Zoom account. Please let Mary Ann know if you would like to set up a committee meeting. She will be glad to attend or set up for you. She expressed gratitude to **Karen Jobe** for helping her with the details of running a Zoom meeting.

**Guest Speakers:** Within the business of the meeting, at 7:15 and 7:40 **Catherine Truitt** and **Jen Mangrum**, respectively, candidates for North Carolina State Superintendent of Public Instruction were given 5 minutes each to speak on their platform with 10 minutes of questioning by President Hart. The session was recorded and is available on the Chi Website. Karen Jobe was the timer.

Members agreed to forego the DKG song and were adjourned at 8:30.
